

Day 1: Depart U.S. for Cairo, Egypt

Day 2: Arrive Cairo We arrive in the Egyptian capital and transfer directly to our hotel. As guests' arrival times may vary greatly, we have no group activities or meals planned.

Day 3: Cairo After a morning briefing, our full-day tour begins at the acclaimed Egyptian Museum, the world's greatest repository of ancient relics. Then we tour the Citadel of Saladin housing the alabaster Mosque of Mohamed Ali; later this afternoon we navigate bustling Khan el-Khalili bazaar. Tonight we enjoy a welcome dinner at a local restaurant. *B,L,D*

Day 4: Cairo/Giza Plateau Today's tour starts at the open-air museum at Memphis, Egypt's first capital (early 4th century BCE). Here, too, we encounter the enigmatic Sphinx, whose leonine body and human face were carved from a single piece of limestone. We continue on to the necropolis at Sakkara then to the Giza Plateau and the Pyramids of Egypt, including the Great Pyramid. *B,L*

Day 5 Cairo/Abu Simbel/Embark Ship Early this morning we fly south to Aswan then continue by coach across the edge of the Sahara to Abu Simbel. We board our deluxe cruise ship in time for lunch, then visit the temples and colossal 65-foot high-statues of Ramses II and his wife Nefertari that were dismantled and moved to higher ground during the construction of the Aswan dam. Tonight, we return to Abu Simbel to watch a dramatic sound-and-light show. *B*₁*L*₁*D*

Day 6: Lake Nasser Cruising – Kasr Ibrim/ Amada/Wadi el-Seboua Early risers can watch the sun climb over the temples at Abu Simbel before we sail to Kasr Ibrim, the last remaining Nubian settlement in its original location. From the Sun Deck we learn about this ancient site (it's forbidden to go ashore here), then sail to Amada, followed by Wadi el-Seboua. *B,L,D*



We enjoy an afternoon sail on the Nile on traditional feluccas.

Day 7: Lake Nasser Cruising – Wadi el-Seboua/Aswan We spend this morning in Wadi el-Seboua exploring the reconstructed Dakka temple, dedicated to Thoth, the messenger of the gods. We also visit the Temple of Meharakka, dedicated to Serapis, a god created to unite the Greek and Egyptian religions. This afternoon we cruise to Aswan, the city where Agatha Christie famously wrote *Death on the Nile* and where we spend the night on board. *B*,*L*,*D*

Day 8: Lake Nasser Cruising – Aswan After a morning at leisure and lunch on board, we set out to tour "new" Kalabsha, site of the largest free-standing Nubian temple of them all, which was moved and reconstructed here from "old" Kalabsha. After exploring the site this afternoon, we return to our ship for an afternoon sail and overnight stay on board in Aswan. We dine together on board this evening. *B,L,D*

Day 9: Disembark/Aswan/Embark Nile Cruise Ship We disembark our ship this morning in the desert lands of Aswan and set out to visit the Nubia Museum, an acclaimed showcase of Nubian art and architecture. Then we travel to Aswan High Dam, considered a miracle of engineering. This afternoon we embark the second deluxe river ship of the tour, our floating hotel for our three-night Nile cruise, before we board small *feluccas* for a relaxing afternoon sail. *B*,*L*,*D*

Day 10: Nile Cruising – Aswan/Kom Ombo

This morning we sail to the site of the ancient trading town at Kom Ombo, which sat on the great caravan route from Nubia. Here we see outstanding Nile views from an unusual double temple, dedicated both to the crocodile god Sobek and to the falcon god Haroeris (Horus the Elder). Then we return to the ship for lunch, and later afternoon tea as we sail to Edfu. *B*,*L*,*D*

Day 11: Nile Cruising – Edfu/Luxor This morning we explore Edfu's Temple of Horus, considered Egypt's best-preserved ancient temple. We return to our ship for lunch and this afternoon's cruise to Luxor (our final sail), as we enjoy afternoon tea along the way. Upon arrival in Luxor this afternoon, we head to the East Bank where we visit the splendid Karnak Temple. We see the temple's enormous

pylons, the Temple of Ramses II, the Great Hypostyle Hall, and the two Obelisks of Hatshepsut. Next, we travel to Luxor Temple. We visit the Great Court of Ramses II, the Temple of the Theban Triad, and the obelisk, whose twin stands in the Place de la Concorde in Paris. Tonight on board is a show of Middle Eastern belly dancing. *B,L,D*

Day 12: Disembark/Luxor We disembark our ship today and set out on an exploration of Luxor. Beginning on the West Bank at the haunting Valley of the Kings and Valley of the Queens, this isolated valley holds the tombs of more than 50 kings, queens, and nobles. This afternoon we tour the Luxor Museum, housing relics discovered at the site. **B**

Day 13: Luxor/Cairo We fly today to Cairo. After checking in at our hotel, the remainder of the day is free for independent exploration and dinner on our own. *B*

Day 14: Cairo This morning we encounter Old Cairo, the district where early capital cities once stood and now only remnants remain. We return to our hotel mid-day; this afternoon is at leisure. Tonight we enjoy a farewell dinner at our hotel. *B,D*

Day 15: Depart for U.S. Early this morning, we transfer to the airport for our return flight to the United States. *B*


