




Educational Focus: Canadian Ranching Heritage and Contemporary Cowboy Life.



COLUMBIA ICEFIELD | JASPER

Excursion: *Columbia Icefield.* This morning, journey to Columbia Icefield, one of the largest accumulations of ice and snow south of the Arctic Circle. Along the way, stop to admire





historic Saskatchewan River Crossing. A specially designed vehicle carries you onto the surface of Athabasca Glacier, one of eight glaciers comprising Columbia Icefield. Your guide provides insight into the icefield's history and geology as you marvel at this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to step onto its centuries-old surface.

Local Flavor: Savor a delicious lunch near the beautiful Sunwapta Falls.


This afternoon, arrive in Jasper and check in to the Sawridge Inn Jasper.

JASPER

Independent Exploration: Enjoy a day at leisure in Jasper.

ELECTIVE | *Maligne Lake Scenic Cruise*. Cruise the cerulean waters of Maligne Lake, the



second largest glacier-fed lake in the world. Soak up gorgeous alpine scenery, and appreciate one of Jasper National Park's most beautiful spots. Learn about the area's history during your cruise, and disembark on Spirit Island to stand among towering pines.

ELECTIVE | Jasper Skytram. Soar to the top of Whistler's Mountain on the Jasper Skytram, the longest and highest guided aerial tramway in Canada. Learn interesting facts about the region's cultural heritage, flora and fauna. Disembark at the Upper Station, 7,000 feet above sea level. Explore interpretive exhibits before stepping out onto the summit where panoramas of six mountain ranges, turquoise lakes and the serpentine Athabasca River await.

DAY FIVE B | D

JASPER

Independent Exploration: Enjoy leisure time this morning in Jasper. Perhaps try a gourmet pastry at the popular Bear Paw Bakery, or browse the alpine town's eclectic mix of shops.


Excursion: Athabasca River Scenic Float.

Take in mesmerizing vistas of the Rockies from a unique vantage point while drifting along the very route once used by fur traders. Listen as your expert guide regales you with tales of Athabasca River's natural and human history. Float past snow-covered peaks and vast canyons while peering into thick pine forest to glimpse wildlife.

Local Flavor: Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant.

Excursion: Jasper Dark Sky Preserve.

Your night begins with an interactive session at Jasper planetarium. Afterwards, venture outside to witness the glories of the night sky. Jasper






National Park spans 4,000 square miles and is the world's second largest Dark Sky Preserve. With your naked eyes, take in the glittering Andromeda Galaxy, the length of the Milky Way and all seven sisters of the Pleiades star cluster. Get up-close views through one of the largest telescopes in the Rockies, and learn how to capture photographs with personal cameras.

DAY SIX B | L

JASPER | BANFF

Excursion: Athabasca Falls and Peyto Lake. Journey to the point where beautiful Athabasca River crashes over its namesake waterfall in a powerful display. Droplets of spray will dampen your skin as you roam the walkways skirting this deafening torrent. Continue on to the tranquil beauty of Peyto Lake. Tucked between mountains and the endless forestland of Mistaya Valley, experience spectacular views of this vivid turquoise lake, named for Bill Peyto, the English explorer who discovered it in 1894.



Local Flavor: View picturesque mountain scenery while enjoying lunch at a local lodge. Upon arrival in the wilderness town of Banff, check in to Moose Hotel & Suites.

Independent Exploration: Enjoy free time in Banff. Discover artwork in Canada House Gallery, or view historic collections in Whyte Museum.

DAY SEVEN B | L

BANFF

Excursion: *Treasures of Banff National Park.* Explore the park's most magical sights, starting with Surprise Corner on Tunnel Mountain Drive. Witness the fairy-tale view of Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel, and watch the glacial waters of Bow Falls flow over limestone bedrock. View the uniquely shaped hoodoo rock formations. Visit Lake Minnewanka, the largest



lake in Banff National Park, and wander the abandoned ruins of Bankhead mining town.

Local Flavor: Gather for lunch in a local restaurant with a Mountie.

Educational Focus: *The Mounties.*

Excursion: *Cave and Basin National Historic Site.* Journey deep into the forest to the birthplace of the Canadian parks system, discovered by three railway workers in 1883. Witness two bubbling hot springs, and experience the site's history as told through interactive exhibits. View the historic bathhouse and emerald waters of the basin.

Excursion: *Banff's Lakes.* Travel to two of Banff's most beautiful lakes. First, witness the intimate and spellbinding majesty of Moraine Lake. Encircled by 10 glistening peaks, the view is so inspiring it decorated the Canadian twenty-dollar bill from 1969 to 1979. Continue on to the "Jewel of the Canadian Rockies," Lake Louise. Enjoy a guided walk near the lake's azure waters. Then, ride in a gondola to experience views of unspoiled wilderness. You may spot a grizzly bear and other wildlife in their natural habitat!

Local Flavor: Enjoy lunch in the crisp mountain air above Lake Louise.
